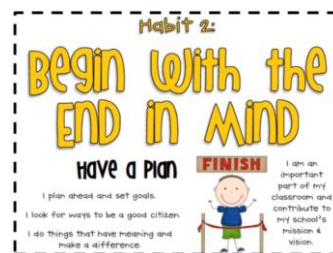
Vision is our #wordoftheweek
