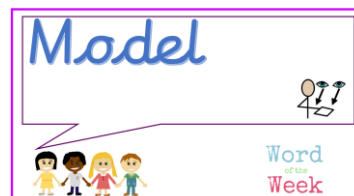
Word of the Week:

What models have helped you in your learning this week?

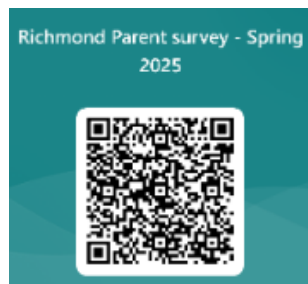

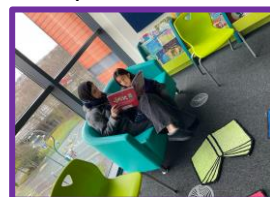
